

Introduction

The Doon Library & Research completed eight years of successful service to the reading public of Dehradun in December 2014. These eight years have been a period of great fulfillment to us. We have also learnt a lot as we blundered along trying to fulfill our mandate of providing a first rate library and learning environment to our members. We have also had our fair share of frustration. Looking back, we can say with some confidence that we have achieved a fair degree of stability. The library has carved a place for itself as an important institution serving the book loving people of the city. Ample evidence is provided by the steady increase in our membership as well as the constant flow of readers to the library. We have reason to feel satisfied, though not complacent, by the progress made by us in this short period of seven years. The number of books on our shelves crossed 21,000 during the year, while the membership crossed 2400. All through the day there is a steady stream of readers in the library.



Both our reading rooms are crowded with readers. Many a time people don't find space to sit. It is indeed a very satisfying sight to see a large number of young people – both boys and girls – sitting for hours together in the reading room busy with books. Many of them are preparing for some competitive examination, and a fair number have also been qualifying. What better testimonial to our contribution than that we have helped many a young person qualify for a job. During the last two years a pleasant sight that has been greeting us during winter months is to see groups of boys and girls sitting in the sun on our tiny lawn and either studying their own books or holding discussion related to their studies. They say the library premises provide a conducive atmosphere to study and discuss among themselves. How we wish we could give them a larger lawn with pleasanter surroundings!

Our biggest problem now is the severe shortage of space. The one big advantage of our present location is our central location; it is easily accessible. Happily, thanks to the efforts of the School Education Department, we have been able to get some additional space in the existing premises. We have made plans to tear down the old and dilapidated structures and build anew to serve the needs of the library. Efforts are on to get funds for the construction.

Another significant development during the year was the grant of Rupees three crore by the Uttarakhand Government to augment our corpus. The corpus now stands at Rupees ten crore. The money is invested in term deposits and the interest thereon is used to meet the expenses of the institution.

During the year we suffered a big loss in the sudden death, after a brief illness, of our Librarian Shri K. C. Saxena on May 8, 2014. He had been the librarian since the very beginning of the institution. In fact he had joined in May 2006 even before the library was formally inaugurated in December 2006. Thus he played a very important role in building the library and laying its foundation and enabling it to develop into a vibrant institution. He will be greatly missed.

We found a good replacement in Shri J. B. Goyal who joined as Librarian on November 03, 2014. Shri Goyal retired from the Instruments Research and Development Establishment (IRDE), Dehradun.

Highlights of the work and progress of the Doon Library & Research Centre during the year are detailed below.

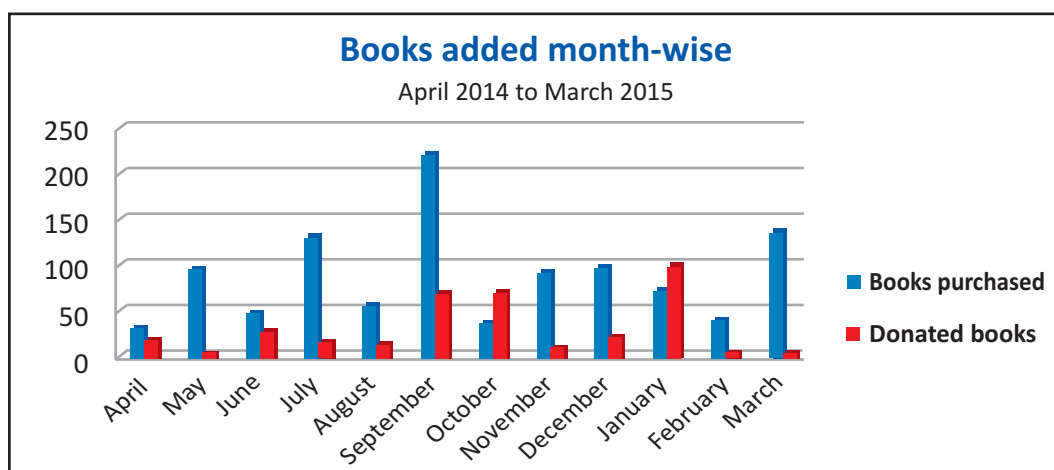
Library

Despite severe shortage of space the library continued to add to its collection of books. At the end of the year it had a total collection of 21,541 volumes as compared to 20,132 at the end of the previous financial year. Thus 1,409 books were added during the year, as compared to 2,181 during the previous year. Admittedly, the pace of acquisition of books has slowed down this year. This is so mainly because we do not have space to properly store and display new acquisitions. It is a common sight for new acquisitions to be placed in two or three rows along the shelves, which makes searching for books a tedious exercise. The year also saw a steady increase in membership from 2,011 (1,811 annual members and 130 life members) at the end of last year to 2,442 at the end of the current year (2,280 annual members and 162 life members).

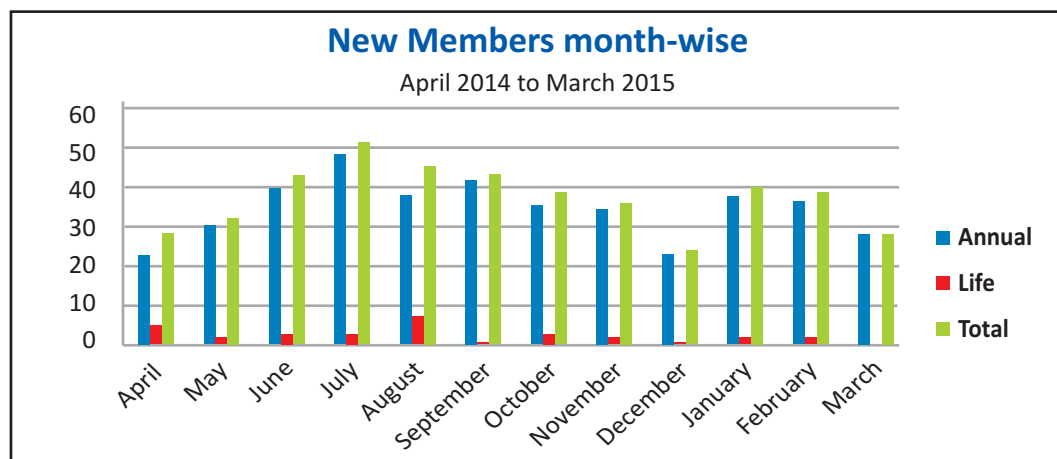

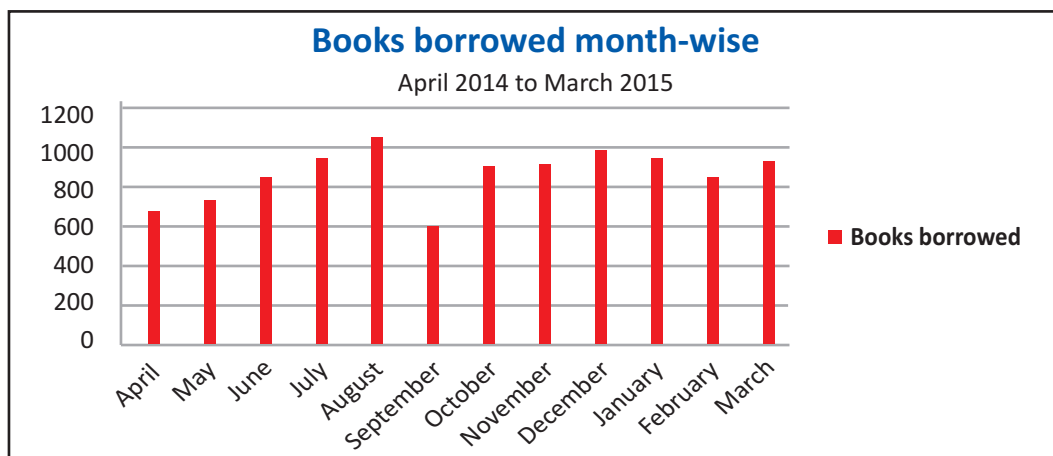

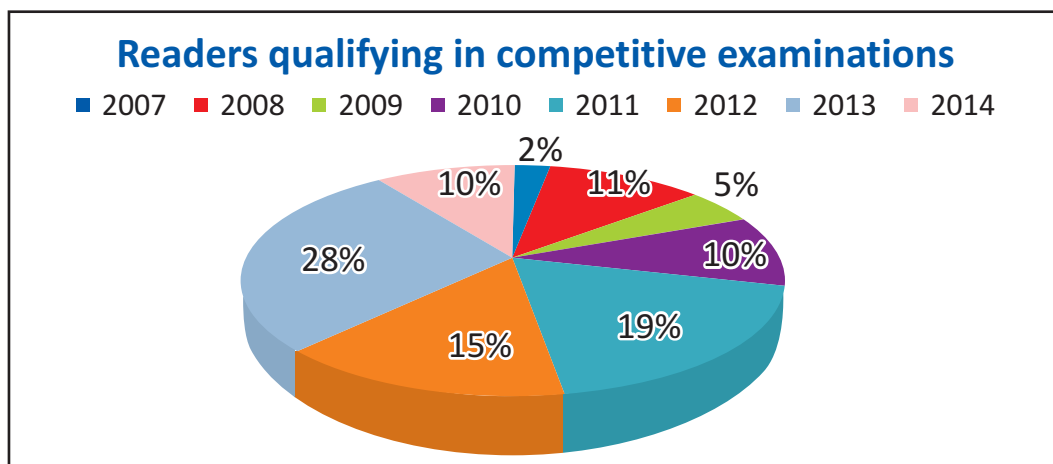

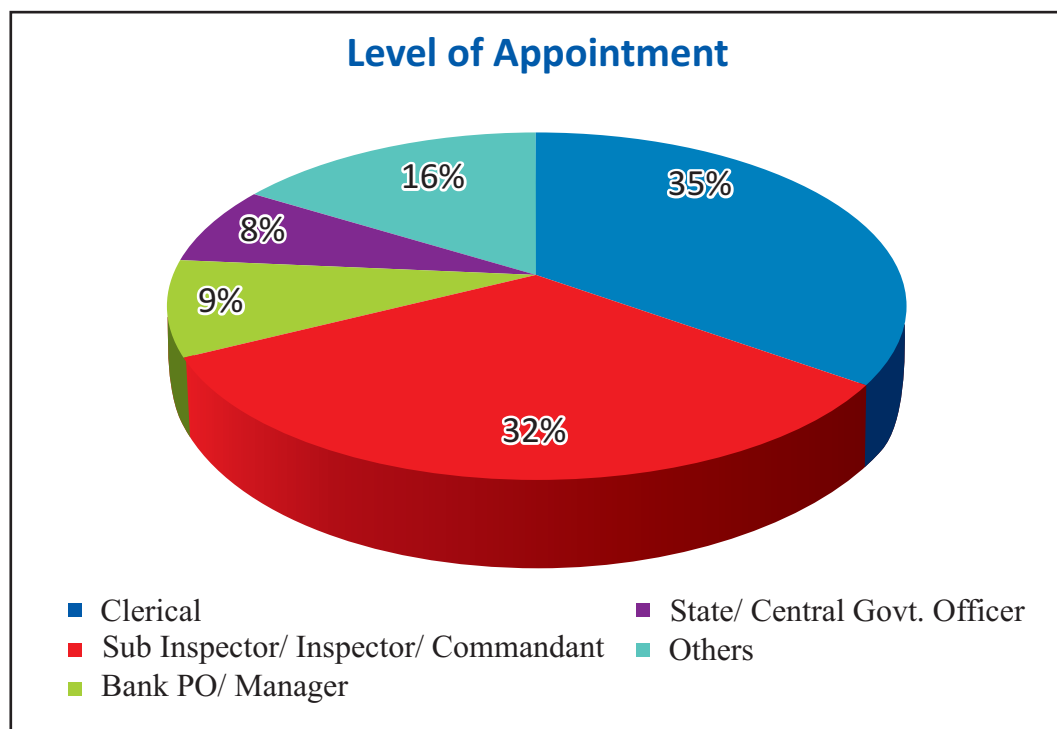

Talks, Discussions etc.

The Doon Library & Research Centre has over the years also created an identity for itself as a forum for informed discussion and exchange of ideas on subjects of contemporary and topical significance through talks by local experts, panel discussions, book discussions, presentations, seminars etc. The idea is to make the library a living institution in regular contact and dialogue with its members and the general public. The success of this activity is evident from the fact that from time to time we receive suggestions for talks or discussions on specific topics and subjects, or for inviting particular persons to give a talk. We welcome all such suggestions and try our best to respond to them. However, we do have our limitations, the most important being that we do not have our own hall and are dependent on hiring halls outside, which may not always be available within our means, which prevent us from holding more programmes.

During the year the following activities in this field were organised:

A panel discussion on the present state of school education was organised on April 19, 2014 at Welham Boys School. The panelists included Prof. Dharendra Sharma, formerly of JNU, Ms Shanti Varma, former Principal, Welham Girls School, Dr Indu Singh, Principal MKP PG College, Shri Hamad Faruqui, Teacher, The Doon School and Dr B. K. Joshi, Hony. Director, Doon Library & Research Centre. The discussion was moderated by Shri Rajen BrijNath, Adviser, Doon Library & Research Centre.



A discussion on "Fostering moral responsibility in society" was organised on July 19, 2014 in the 'Manthan' conference centre. The lead speaker was Prof. Girijesh Pant, former Vice Chancellor Doon University and Professor, JNU. The other speakers were Dr Sekhar Raha, Prof. Sumanta Banerjee, Mrs Shanti Verma, Dr Indu Singh and Shri Pankaj Gupta of Industries Association of Uttarakhand. The programme was moderated by Shri Rajen BrijNath, Adviser, Doon Library & Research Centre.

On **July 23, 2014** a discussion on “Urdu, The Language of Urban Popular Culture in North India” was organised in the library. Among the issues highlighted the following deserve special mention:

- In the colloquial language of North India Urdu words are used freely.
- The works, both prose and poetry, of the best Urdu writers are now easily available in the Nagari script.
- One of the main reasons for survival and flourishing of Urdu after Independence is that all the eminent names of Urdu Literature, both in prose and poetry, wrote for films which have a large mass audience.

On **August 8, 2014** a launch of the book *‘Lucknow ka Uttarakhand’* published by the Doon Library & Research Centre was held in Lucknow under the auspices of *Nisarga Srijan Sansthan*. The book has been written by senior journalist and author Shri Navin Joshi. Well-known Hindi litterateur Shri Shekhar Joshi presided over the function. Noted environmentalist, and geologist Shri Vijay Kumar Joshi, scientist Shri N. C. Shah, and well-known theatre personality Ms. Asha Dhasmana were special guests on the occasion. From the Doon Library & Research Centre Shri Chandra Shekhar Tewari, Research Associate participated in the function.

On **August 9, 2014** a programme in remembrance of Hiroshima Day was organised in collaboration with Science Writers Association at ‘Manthan’ Conference Centre. The theme of the programme was “Security of Life in a Globalised World”. Noted scientist and crusader against atomic weapons Prof. Dharendra Sharma presided.



Following past practice the Doon Library & Research Centre organised a programme in celebration of Librarians' Day, which commemorates the birth anniversary of Dr S. Ranganathan, the 'father' of Library Science in India on **August 12, 2014**. Dr S. Farooq, President, Himalaya Drug Company was the Chief Guest. A number of Librarians of the city attended and recalled the contribution of Dr Ranganathan to the development of library science and the library movement in India. Dr B. K. Joshi, Honorary Director, Doon Library & Research Centre presided over the function.

On **September 5, 2014** a poetry reading session was held in the library. Ms. Preeti Tiwari, Dr Nutan Dimri-Gairola, Ms. Shams-un-Nisa Khan, Dr Manoj Panjani, Ms. Fatima Ali and Shri Manish Saras read their poems.

The Doon Library and Research Centre organized a book reading session of Raghav Chandra's *Scent of a Game* on **September 6, 2014**. The author is an IAS Officer of the Madhya Pradesh cadre and presently posted as Additional Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Govt. of India. The book deals with the serious subject of poaching of



wild life, especially tigers in an easy to read story-telling style. The locales of the events described in the book are Kanha and Panna Tiger Reserve in Madhya Pradesh.

The book was introduced by Shri Sanjeev Chopra IAS, Jt. Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Govt. of India. He also read excerpts from the book. Shri Raghav Chandra showed slides to highlight the fate of forests, wild life statistics and the population of tigers. He then talked about his book and read excerpts from it. A number of senior forest officers of Uttarakhand and eminent citizens of Dehradun

attended. Those who shared their experiences of conserving tigers and wildlife included Shri Rajiv Bhartari, Chief Conservator of Forests Uttarakhand and ex-Director, Corbett Tiger Reserve, Shri Jai Raj, Additional Principal Chief Conservator of Forests Uttarakhand, and Ms. Jyotsna Sittling, Chief Conservator of Forests, Uttarakhand. Also present on the occasion were industrialist and Philanthropist Dr S Farooq and Shri STS Lepcha, Chief Conservator of Forests, Uttarakhand. Professor Dharendra Sharma, Former Professor, JNU The vote of thanks was given by Rajen Brijnath, Advisor, Doon Library and Research Centre.



On **September 23, 2014** on the seventh death anniversary of Qurratulain Haider, three stories written by her which had an Uttarakhand backdrop were read in the library. *Jugnuon ke Beech*, based in Almora was read by Meenakshi Kukreti-Bhardwaj, *Kohre ke Peeche* based in Mussoorie was read by Shams-un-Nisa Khan and *Dalanwala* based in Dehradun was read by Fatima Ali.

A talk and discussion with a young Hindi writer Chaitanya Kumari was organised on **February 10, 2015** in the library premises. A number of young readers of the library participated in the spirited discussion and question-and-answer session with the writer. The programme was coordinated by Dr Manoj Panjani.

Film Related Programmes

On **April 22, 2014** a programme to commemorate the centenary of the film maker B R Chopra was organized. Dr Manoj Panjani spoke about the life and films of B R Chopra. Clips from a number of films made by Chetan Anand were shown. An interview given by Achala Nagar was read out by Urdu writer Naseem Bano Ansari. Messages from lyricist Hasan Kamal, sound recordist B K Chaturvedi and producer Ravichand Nalappa were also read out.

On **July 11, 2014** a tribute was paid to the noted theater personality, Zohra Sehgal. Clips of film songs choreographed by her in a few films were shown. The highlight of the program was a talk by Vinita Shetty, who had interacted professionally with her when she was doing the make up for many artistes during a stage play based on the *Ramayan* in which Zohra Sehgal enacted the role of *Soorpanakha*.

On **January 3, 2015** the Doon Library and Research Centre organized a programme to commemorate the centenary of film maker Chetan Anand, who had played a major role in putting Indian cinema on the world map. A DVD of a tribute by Javed Akhter was screened. Excerpts from articles written by him and on him and messages from cameraman Adeep Tandon and editor Keshav Naidu were read by Dr Manoj Panjani. Clips of some of his films were also shown

Research

A small research study supported by the Doon Library & Research Centre was initiated. The study is being conducted supervised by Dr B. K. Joshi and is being conducted by Shri Chandra Shekhar Tewari, research Associate. The study involves resurvey of three villages in Almora district. A socio-economic survey of these three villages had first been undertaken in 1980-81 by Dr B. K. Joshi while he was working at the Giri Institute of Development Studies, Lucknow. These same villages had been studied again in 1996 by two researchers, Nehal Farooquee and D. S. Rawat of the G. B. Pant Institute of Himalayan Environment & Development. A third survey is now being undertaken in the belief that it will provide a comparative picture on important socio-economic variables in order to highlight the changes that have occurred over a span of three-and-a-half decades in these villages.

Accounts

The audited accounts for 2014-15 show a total income of Rs 70.01 lakh. Of this Rs 66.37 lakh was from interest on fixed deposits, mainly on the corpus of Rs 7 crores. It may be mentioned that during the last week of March 2015 another instalment of Rs 3 crores for the corpus was received from the State Government, thereby increasing the total corpus to Rs 10 crores. However, interest income on this additional amount will only accrue during the next financial year. Membership fees contributed Rs 2.27 lakhs. Fine on overdue books, interest on savings bank account, sale of publications, grant for publication and miscellaneous items accounted for the rest. As against this revenue expenditure during the year was Rs. 41.37 lakhs: Rs 39.56 lakhs on account of administrative expenses (break-up of items of administrative expenses given in Schedule K), Rs 0.66 lakhs on Programmes and other activities, Rs 0.65 lakhs on Research Studies and Rs 0.50 lakhs on Seminars. Capital expenditure was Rs 9.03 lakhs during the year (break-up of items of capital expenses given in Schedule G). Total expenditure thus came to Rs 50.40 lakhs.

The main items of administrative expenses were: Salary and honorarium Rs 25.17 lakhs, Repair & Maintenance Rs 3.33 lakhs, Security & Cleaning charges Rs 1.84 lakhs, Printing and Stationery Rs 0.83 lakhs, and Subscription of Journals Rs 0.54 lakhs.

Capital expenses consisted mainly of purchase of books worth Rs 6.15 lakhs, Furniture and Fixtures Rs 0.88 lakhs and Computers and Peripherals Rs. 1.69 lakhs

The balance sheet and details of income and expenditure along with the auditor's report are attached.



AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Members of **Doon Library & Research Centre, Dehradun, Uttarakhand**

We have examined the accompanying financial statements of **Doon Library & Research Centre, Dehradun, Uttarakhand**, which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2015 and the Income and Expenditure Account for the year then ended.

Management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements. This responsibility includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation of the financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Society's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations furnished to us, the financial statements of Doon Library & Research Centre, Dehradun, Uttarakhand, for the year ended March 31st, 2015 are prepared in the manner required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India.
